Instructional materials may be printed or non printed, and may include textbooks, technology-based materials, other educational materials, and tests."

Sufficiency of instructional materials is defined in Ed Code 1240(c)(2)(B) to mean that each pupil has sufficient textbooks and instructional materials in the four core areas as defined by Section 60119. Ed Code 60119(c)(1) states that sufficient textbooks or instructional materials means "each pupil, including English Learners, has a standards-aligned textbook or instructional materials, or both, to use in class and to take home."

BACKGROUND INFORMATION AND/OR STATEMENT OF NEED

The Humboldt County Committee on School District Organization is composed of eleven members, two for each of the Supervisorial Areas and one member at large. The County Committee responds to petitions for school district reorganization, including unifications, formations, dissolutions, lapsations, annexations, and boundary alterations. Additionally, the County Committee has the power to establish trustee areas, rearrange the boundaries of trustee areas, abolish trustee areas, adopt one of the alternative methods of electing governing board members, and increase or decrease the number of members of the governing board in any school district or community college district.

The selection of County Committee members is a two step process. The first step is for school district governing boards to take action to select one board member to serve on a delegation that will then elect members of the County Committee. The second step is for the County Superintendent to convene a meeting of the delegation that will elect County Committee members to vacant positions, or to positions that have expired terms.

The Humboldt County Committee on School District Organization is composed of eleven members, two for each of the Supervisorial Areas and one member at large. The County Committee responds to petitions for school district reorganization, including unifications, formations, dissolutions, lapsations, annexations, and boundary alterations. Additionally, the County Committee has the power to establish trustee areas, rearrange the boundaries of trustee areas, abolish trustee areas, adopt one of the alternative methods of electing governing board members, and increase or decrease the number of members of the governing board in any school district or community college

There are vacant positions in Supervisorial Areas 2 and 4, as well as terms ending for a member in Supervisorial Area 1. Supervisorial Areas may be found at this link:

https://humboldtgov.org/167/Board-of-Supervisors Members of the County Committee are elected by representatives of each district board during an annual meeting held between October 1 and December 1. This year the meeting will be held on November 6 at 5:30 PM in the Annex Conference Room. In order to ensure each district representative is able to participate in the election process, we will provide the option of voting by absentee ballot.

The selection of County Committee members is a two step process. The first step is for school district governing boards to take action to select one board member to serve on a delegation that will then elect members of the County Committee. The second step is for the County Superintendent to convene a meeting of the delegation that will elect County Committee members to vacant positions, or to positions that have expired terms.

Members of school district governing boards may serve concurrently as a school district trustee and County Committee member. No county superintendent of schools, employee of the office of a county superintendent of schools, employee of a school district, or employee of a community college district shall be a member of the County Committee.

During your October board meeting, please select one board member as a representative to serve on the delegation that will elect members of the County Committee. We ask that you provide the name and contact information of your delegate representative to Natalie Carrigan via email at ncarrigan@hcoe.org.

NHUHSD will provide the Facilities (and any associated equipment) for use by (MCSD) subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement. (MCSD) and its employees may use the Facilities subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

4. **Modifications:**

This Agreement may be modified or amended in writing without additional consideration at any time by mutual consent of the parties.

5. **Applicable Law and Venue:**

This Agreement will be governed by the law of the State of California and venue shall be in the Superior Court of Humboldt County and no other place. Every provision or clause required by law to be inserted in this Agreement shall be deemed to be inserted and the Agreement shall be read and enforced as though it were included. If for any reason such provision is not inserted, or is not correctly stated, then upon application of either party, the changes shall be made by amendment to this Agreement which is acceptable to both parties.

6. Execution in Counterparts:

This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be an original, but all of which together shall constitute one instrument.

7. Authorization:

Each individual executing this Agreement, or its counterpart, on behalf of the respective party, warrants that he/she is authorized to do so and that this Agreement constitutes the legally binding obligation of the entity which he/she represents.

8. No Third Part Beneficiaries:

Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to create any duty or any liability to any person or entity not at party to this Agreement.

9. Additional Conditions:

- A. While providing services under this Agreement, NHUHSD is an independent contractor and not an officer, agent, or employee of (MCSD). NHUHSD shall not perform any services otherwise provided for under this Agreement if specifically not requested to do so by (MCSD), nor interfere with the policy-making functions of (MCSD) unless expressly requested to do so. The parties also understand that some of the services to be performed under this Agreement may require additional express written authorization from (MCSD) and will not be performed unless and until such authorization is given.
- B. NHUHSD shall hold harmless, defend and indemnify (MCSD) from and against any liability, claim, action, cost, damage or loss for injury, including death, to any person or damage to any property to the extent that such is caused by, or results from, the negligence or misconduct of NHUHSD or its officers, agents, or employees or others under its control. This obligation shall continue beyond the term of this Agreement as to any act or omission which occurred during or under this Agreement.
- C. (MCSD) shall hold harmless, defend and indemnify NHUHSD from and against any liability, claim, action, cost, damage or loss for injury, including death, to any person or damage to any property to the extent that such is caused by, or results from, the negligence or misconduct of (MCSD) or its officers, agents, or employees or others under its control. This obligation shall continue beyond the term of this Agreement as to any act or omission which occurred during or under this Agreement.
- D. This Agreement may be terminated at any time by either party upon thirty (30) days prior written notice. Any notice of termination shall be transmitted via hand delivery, facsimile or U.S. mail.

10. Scope of Work and Compensation:

NHUHSD will provide transportation of Special Education students of the (MCSD).

Apportionment for Special Education Transportation and excess costs at a rate of \$N/A per mile. The per mile charge will be adjusted quarterly to reflect increased fuel prices of 5% or greater as of July 1, 2023.

In the event that it is impossible to transport a student with disabilities due to medical needs, safety issues for the student or passengers, availability of drivers, or other unforeseen circumstances, alternative transportation may need to be secured. Alternative transportation will be discussed with (MCSD) to determine the best solution available. If the best solution of alternative transportation is provided by NHUHSD and creates an additional expense, the additional expense will be covered by (MCSD).

X IV. Maintenance Service:

TITLE 2. ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY EDUCATION [33000 - 65001] (Title 2 enacted by Stats. 1976, Ch. 1010.) DIVISION 3. LOCAL ADMINISTRATION [35000 - 45500] (Division 3 enacted by Stats. 1976, Ch. 1010.) PART 21. LOCAL EDUCATIONAL AGENCIES [35000 - 35787] (Part 21 enacted by Stats. 1976, Ch. 1010.) CHAPTER 4. Reorganization of School Districts [35700 - 35787] (Chapter 4 added by Stats. 1980, Ch. 1192, Sec. 3.)

ARTICLE 5. Lapsation [35780 - 35787] (Article 5 added by Stats. 1980, Ch. 1192, Sec. 3.)

- (a) A school district that has been organized for more than three years shall be lapsed as provided in this article 35780 if the number of registered electors in the school district is less than six or if the average daily attendance of pupils in the school or schools maintained by the school district is less than six in kindergarten and grades 1 to 8, inclusive, or is less than 11 in grades 9 to 12, inclusive. The county board of education may defer the lapsation of the school district for one year upon adoption of a resolution approved by a majority of the members of the governing board of the school district and written concurrence of the county superintendent of schools.
- (b) For a new district that has been unable to provide the school facilities necessary for instructional services by employees of the school district to all of the pupils who are residents of the school district after five years from the date that the reorganization became effective, the county committee on school district organization, upon direction from the state board, shall initiate lapsation procedures pursuant to Section 35783 or revert the reorganized district to its original status.
- (c) A school district may also be lapsed when there are no school facilities or sites on which to maintain any school in the school district.
- (d) A school district may also be lapsed upon adoption of a resolution approved by a majority of the members of the governing board of the school district and written concurrence of the county superintendent of schools.

(Amended by Stats. 2022, Ch. 52, Sec. 13. (AB 181) Effective June 30, 2022.)

For purposes of this article, the following terms have the following meanings: 35780.1.

- (a) "Lapse" means dissolving a school district and annexing the entire territory of that school district to one or more adjoining school districts.
- (b) "Lapsation" means an action to lapse as defined by this section.

(Amended by Stats. 2016, Ch. 186, Sec. 36. (AB 2659) Effective January 1, 2017.)

The attendance of pupils residing in a unified district in high schools in an adjoining state pursuant to Section 35781.44618 or Article 1 (commencing with Section 2000) of Chapter 7 of Part 2, shall be deemed for the purposes of this article to be in high schools established and maintained by the unified district.

(Repealed and added by Stats. 1980, Ch. 1192, Sec. 3.)

Within 45 days before the close of each school year, the county committee shall conduct a public hearing on the 35762 issues specified in Section 35780. Notice of the public hearing shall be given at least 10 days in advance of the hearing to each member of the governing board of the lapsed district immediately before its lapsation, to each of the governing boards that adjoin the lapsed district, and to the high school district of which the lapsed elementary district is a component.

(Amended by Stats. 2014, Ch. 327, Sec. 6. (AB 1599) Effective January 1, 2015.)

After the hearing, and at least 30 days before the end of the school year, the county committee shall order the 35783 territory annexed to one or more adjoining districts as seems to the county committee to be in the best interest of the adjoining districts and the residents of the lapsed district.

(Amended by Stats. 2014, Ch. 327, Sec. 7. (AB 1599) Effective January 1, 2015.)

If the county committee orders the territory of a lapsed district annexed to more than one adjoining district, it 35784,may provide for such a division of the funds, property, and obligations of the lapsed district as it deems most equitable in the circumstances. If no division is provided for by the committee, the general provisions of Article 7 (commencing with Section 35560) of Chapter 3 shall apply to the division of funds, property, and obligations of the lapsed district.

(Added by Stats. 1980, Ch. 1192, Sec. 3.)

Following the order of the county committee, the county superintendent of schools shall give notice of the board 35785, action to the county board of supervisors and to the State Board of Education.

(Added by Stats. 1980, Ch. 1192, Sec. 3.)

An order of a county committee attaching the territory of a lapsed school district to one or more adjoining school 35786.districts shall be effective for all purposes on the July 1 after date of the order. Notwithstanding Section 35534, the effective date of the order is not subject to compliance with Section 54900 of the Government Code. Compliance with Section 54900 of the Government Code is required by December 1 of the year in which the order is made.

Except as otherwise provided in this article, an action to lapse a school district is subject to the provisions of 35787. Chapter 3 (commencing with Section 35500), and the county committee may add to its order to lapse a school district, pursuant to Section 35783, appropriate provisions specified in Article 3 (commencing with Section 35730).

Re: Lapsation Process

On September 11, the two Boards of Trustees identified above will conduct a joint special meeting to discuss issues common to both boards. One topic on the proposed agenda is consolidation of the two districts. The other is the possible lapsation of the Maple Creek Elementary School District, which will occur next spring if a waiver of lapsation is not obtained from the California State Board of Education. Maple Creek applied for such a waiver in October, 2022, and the State Board granted it through the 2023-24 school year.

This memorandum is intended to briefly summarize the lapsation process and how it would affect Maple Creek.

Lapsation of School Districts

Lapsation is provided for under California law as a way to deal with school districts whose student population, or whose adult population of registered voters, falls below certain thresholds. The term "lapsation" of a school district is defined by Education Code § 35780.1 to mean, "dissolving a school district and annexing the entire territory of that school district to one or more adjoining school districts." Sections 35780-35787 provide for the lapsation process.

The primary statute is Education Code § 35780, which provides as follows:

(a) A school district that has been organized for more than three years shall be lapsed as provided in this article if the number of registered electors in the school district is less than six or if the average daily attendance of pupils in the school or schools maintained by the school district is less than six in kindergarten and grades 1 to 8, inclusive, or is

less than 11 in grades 9 to 12, inclusive. The county board of education may defer the lapsation of the school district for one year upon adoption of a resolution approved by a majority of the members of the governing board of the school district and written concurrence of the county superintendent of schools.

- (b) For a new district that has been unable to provide the school facilities necessary for instructional services by employees of the school district to all of the pupils who are residents of the school district after five years from the date that the reorganization became effective, the county committee on school district organization, upon direction from the state board, shall initiate lapsation procedures pursuant to Section 35783 or revert the reorganized district to its original status.
- (c) A school district may also be lapsed when there are no school facilities or sites on which to maintain any school in the school district.
- (d) A school district may also be lapsed upon adoption of a resolution approved by a majority of the members of the governing board of the school district and written concurrence of the county superintendent of schools.

That last subdivision, whereby a district can be lapsed essentially upon request, and with the concurrence of the county superintendent, was just added by the Legislature in 2022—essentially to permit an expedited process without waiting for lapsation at the end of the school year by the County Committee as provided elsewhere in the statutes.

The Lapsation Process

The process for lapsation is set forth in Education Code §§ 35782-35787, as follows:

- County Committee Hearing: When a district falls below either the average daily attendance or district population thresholds under the statute, the county committee on school district organization conducts a public hearing within 45 days of the end of the school year.
- 2. <u>Notice of Hearing</u>: Notice of the hearing must be provided to each member of the lapsed district's governing board at least 10 days in advance of the hearing. Notice must also be given to the governing boards of the districts that adjoin the lapsed district and the high school district that serves a lapsed elementary district. The Education Code does not specify a location for the hearing nor a format or formal findings to be used in the proceeding.
- 3. No Discretion Not to Lapse: If a district falls below the minimum numbers listed in § 35780 (fewer than 6 students in grades 1-8, fewer than 11 students in grades 9-12), the county committee has no discretion whether to dissolve the district; barring another waiver from the State Board, lapsation at that point is mandatory. It does have discretion

over how the territory and property of the lapsed district is distributed between the adjoining districts.

- 4. <u>County Committee Annexation Decision</u>: After the hearing, and at least 30 days before the end of the school year, the county committee shall order the annexation of the lapsed district territory to one or more of the adjoining districts. The county committee makes this determination "as seems . . . to be in the best interests of the adjoining districts and the residents of the lapsed district." (Education Code § 35783.)
- 5. County Committee Division of Assets: If the county committee orders the annexation of the lapsed district's territory to be divided among more than one adjoining district, the county committee may provide for the division of the lapsed district's funds, properties, and obligations amongst those districts as it deems "most equitable in the circumstances." If all territory is annexed to one district, then all assets would go to that district. (Education Code § 35784.)
 - a. Committee Failure to Act: If the county committee fails to act, the division of assets and liabilities of the lapsed district follows the Reorganization of School Districts chapter of Education Code § 35560 et. seq., which gives real property and personal property to the district where the real property is located, and all other property, funds, or obligations are divided proportionally among the districts in which the lapsed district is included.
 - b. <u>Best practice</u>: In preparation for the county committee review, a list of assets, property, funds, and obligations should be compiled by the lapsing district.
- Notice to the County and State: Once the county committee makes its order to dissolve the district, the county superintendent must give notice to the county board of supervisors and the State Board of Education. (Education Code § 35785.)
- 7. <u>Effective Date</u>: The transfer of territory becomes effective on July 1 after the date of the county committee's order. (Education Code § 35786.) The governing board of the lapsed district continues to function with all of the its powers and duties until the reorganization is "complete" and "effective." (Education Code § 35533.)
- 8. <u>Employment Issues</u>: Education Code §§ 35555-35559 addresses employment issues of individuals employed in the district to be lapsed. Rights of employees are different depending on the employment status (probationary; certificated, classified) for the relevant staff and job duties. In general, though, when a district is reorganized through any process (unification, de-unification, etc.) the legislative policy appears to be that, at least for permanent employees, the transition should be as seamless as possible from the employees' point of view.

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Waiver Option

Despite the mandatory language of Education Code § 35780, a district near lapsation may seek a waiver from the lapsation provisions of the Education Code from the State Board of Education. As noted above, Maple Creek is currently operating under such a waiver, which runs through the current school years. The typical basis cited in seeking a waiver is that the district anticipates having six or more students in future years based on the number of pre-TK or kindergarten-age students living in the district. Geographical hardship or uniqueness is another basis to seek a waiver.

Differing High School Districts

One final issue is that, if the practical effect of lapsation would be to combine the territory of the Kneeland and Maple Creek Elementary Districts, this could potentially create a problem under Education Code §§ 35540 and 35541. Those two statutes provide as follows:

Sec. 35540: The boundaries of each high school district and unified school district shall be coextensive with the boundaries of the component districts, as defined in Section 35515, included within it.

Sec. 35541: When the boundaries of a district which is a component of a high school district or a unified school district, as defined in Section 35515, are for any cause changed to include territory in, or to exclude from, the district, the territory added to, or removed from, the district shall, at the same time, be included in, or excluded from, the high school district or unified school district.

These two statutes apply to "regular" reorganizations, including voluntary district consolidation and territory transfers. Combining the two elementary districts here, at least initially, presents a problem because Kneeland is within the territory of the Eureka City Schools, while Maple Creek is within the territory of Northern Humboldt Union High School District. Neither of those districts will want to lose territory as a result of either the reorganization of the two districts, nor of the lapsation of Maple Creek.

Nevertheless, given the inflexibility of the lapsation statutes, lapsation of the two districts, would appear to avoid those statutes and permit annexation of Maple Creek District into Kneeland (if that is the County Committee's decision) despite §§ 35540 and 35541. The lapsation process would effect a de facto territory transfer of the affected high school district's territory as well.
